PALM SUNDAY OF THE LORD'S PASSION - MARCH 24, 2024

This weekend (March 23rd/24th), the Church celebrates **Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion**. On this rare occasion, we hear two gospel readings today: That of our Lord's triumphal entry into Jerusalem and of His Passion. Having these two Gospels proclaimed in one liturgy reminds us of the great drama that is unfolding during Holy Week: Welcomed by great crowds into Jerusalem, within five days, those same crowds cry out "*Crucify Him!*"

I cannot encourage you enough to take part in the liturgies of the Paschal Triduum. These three days begin *Holy Thursday* evening with the Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7 PM, continues *Good Friday* with the Celebration of the Lord's Passion at 1 PM (a truly unique celebration in our liturgical year), and culminates with the magnificent Easter Vigil at 9 PM on *Holy Saturday*. In these three days, we are taken on a tour of the entirety of salvation history.

These three main liturgies (which are, truly, one continuous liturgy) are accented by a number of other celebrations, including watching the *Passion movie* on Monday at 7 PM, various times of *confession* throughout the week, chances to join in the *Liturgy of the Hours* during the *Paschal Triduum*, and the chance to walk the *Stations of the Cross* at 7 PM and join in our *Tenebrae service* at 8 PM on Good Friday evening.

All of these offerings are meant for one purpose: To aid us in being led to a far deeper appreciation of the depths of everything that God has done for us. Do not be afraid to think of **Holy Week** as a week of "retreat." In this week, we have the opportunity to bring our Lenten journey to fulfilment and embrace the many graces that God has gifted to us in these forty days as we near the empty tomb. We will have the full **Easter season** to truly *unpack* these graces.

THE CHRISM MASS AT THE CATHEDRAL

Have you ever attended the **Chrism Mass**? It is the annual celebration of the institution of the priesthood, one of the two principal mysteries of *Holy Thursday* (along, of course, with the institution of the Eucharist). At the **Chrism Mass**, the Bishop consecrates the Sacred Chrism: the oil used for the ordination of priests, anointing after Baptism, and for Confirmation. He also blesses the Oil of the Sick and the Oil of Catechumens.

These oils will be sent out to the parishes of the diocese and presented to each parish at the **Mass of the Lord's Supper** on *Holy Thursday* for use throughout the year. In addition to the blessing of oils, it is also the evening on which the priests of the diocese renew our priestly promises. It is truly a unique and beautiful Mass. If you have never attended before, I encourage you to do so: **Tuesday, March 26th, at 7 PM at the Cathedral in Fort Wayne**.

HOLY WEEK—NEAR AND FAR

As a part of our outreach to our local community, we sent out a county-wide mailer this week with an invitation for all to join us for our celebration of the **Paschal Triduum**. On the mailer, we listed our primary Mass times for the **Triduum**. Our full **Holy Week** schedule, including additional confession times, can be found in today's insert. As we prepare for **Holy Week**, may we also be prepared to welcome new guests into the life of our parish family.

For those who may be traveling this coming week due to Spring Break, do not be afraid to enter the life of the parishes where you are visiting. Part of the beauty of our Catholic Faith is seeing that the Church is truly *catholic*, which means universal. Though separated by distance, we remain united as one in prayer. You can find local Mass times wherever you may be traveling by using *MassTimes.org* or by calling the local parish.

Palm Sunday



People of Jerusalem welcome Jesus as king as he triumphantly enters the city



Crowd waves palms and lays cloaks on the ground before him



Jesus rides in on a donkey to fulfill Old Testament prophecies



The liturgy begins with blessing of palms, an extra reading about Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, and a procession while the congregation waves palms to play the part of the crowds



Take the palms and place them in your home or workplace as a witness to faith in Jesus' Paschal Victory

Put yourself in the shoes of the people who first welcomed Christ as king, but in a matter of days, called for his crucifixion

Though chronologically three days, the PASCHAL TRIDUUM is one liturgical day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery

Holy Thursday



Jesus celebrates the Last Supper with his Apostles



Jesus institutes the Eucharist and constitutes the Apostles as priests



Displaying great humility, Jesus washes the feet of his Apostles



Gives mandatum, command to love one another as he has loved them



During the agony in the garden, he accepts God's will, then is arrested



At the end of Mass the altar is stripped and all decorations are covered or removed. Even the tabernacle is emptied and all consecrated hosts are moved to an Altar of Repose to mimic the absence and loss felt by the disciples during Jesus' agony and death.

No final blessing as the liturgical day continues



Maintain silence

Spend an hour in adoration

Good Friday



While Jesus was being questioned, Peter denies him three times



Pilate has Jesus scourged and a crown of thorns put on his head



Jesus carries his own cross to Calvary, where he is crucified



With the words, "It is finished," Jesus dies and darkness descends



Jesus is taken down from the cross and placed in the tomb



This is the only day of the year where no Masses are celebrated, and no sacraments are performed, unless it's an emergency

Candles are only lit during the liturgy when the Eucharist is present and during the Veneration of the Cross



Fasting and abstinence from meat

Pray the Stations of the Cross

Maintain silence during the hours Jesus was on the cross

Easter Sunday



Jesus rises, conquering death, and opening the path to new life!




Empty tomb is found first by the holy women, then by Peter and John



Jesus appears to multiple groups of disciples, they see and believe



Take part in a festive gathering with family and friends to honor this day as the highest of feasts



Keep the celebration going during the Octave of Easter for eight days, and the Easter season for 50 days until Pentecost



Catechumens receive sacraments of initiation, and the whole congregation renews baptismal yows

We sing Alleluia again for the first time since the beginning of Lent

The new Paschal candle is carried into the church and the congregations' candles are lit from it
