PENTECOST SUNDAY - MAY 23, 2021

This weekend (May 22nd/23rd), the Church celebrates the **Solemnity of Pentecost**. This celebration marks the *fiftieth day* since **Easter Sunday** and brings a close to the **Easter season**, or **Eastertide**. Traditionally, **Pentecost** served as the second highest solemnity of the entire liturgical year, second only to **Easter** itself. Similar to **Easter**, it was celebrated as an octave, or eight full days of celebration, until the most recent revision of the liturgical calendar following the Second Vatican Council.

Though the celebration of **Pentecost** may have been shortened, we see a focus on the Holy Spirit reflected in the remaining weeks of the liturgical calendar throughout **Ordinary Time**. Throughout the coming weeks, our readings return again to Jesus' teaching ministry in the **Gospel of St. Mark**. As the Apostles, filled with the Holy Spirit, are sent out into the world, so are we. Working with this same spirit, we begin to try and put the Lord's teachings to action in our lives.

BAPTISMAL FONT REPAIR AND RESTORATION

On Friday, our baptismal font was taken in for scheduled maintenance. As you may recall, our St. Joseph Women's Group (officially rebranded as "A G.I.R.L.'s Night Out") hosted a fundraiser earlier this year to support the repair and renovation of our baptismal font. Working with Mazzolini Artcraft of Cleveland, which specializes in church stonework, this repair and renovation project is now underway.

As a part of the initial repair process, the Mazzolini team will clean our limestone font and tend to the various chips, cracks, and scratches that have arisen from years of general wear and tear. For the renovation process, the team will remove the interior partitions within the baptismal bowl itself. An artistic inlay will be placed within the interior of the bowl, which will then be sealed to prevent water damage. We will no longer need to perch a glass bowl precariously between the partitions for baptisms, but will be able to use the full font itself.

Once completed, our font will be placed in the narthex. Historically, our font has been placed in many different locations throughout our current church building. From all accounts, it was originally placed in the Usher's Room, which served as our original baptistry. It has also found itself placed under the Infant of Prague statue on the south-side of the church and in various locations throughout the sanctuary.

With the additions to our church building twenty years ago, we now have the opportunity to place the font in the center of the narthex. In baptism, we are incorporated into the Church as we become members of the Body of Christ. Having the baptismal font in the narthex, we are given a visual reminder of our baptism and our entry into the Church, the Body of Christ here on earth, every time that we physically enter the church building itself.

This new location of our baptismal font will also assist at funeral liturgies. At the very beginning of a Mass of Christian Burial, the body of our deceased loved one is greeted at the back of the church and sprinkled with holy water in remembrance of their baptism. This sprinkling will now be able to occur at our baptismal font itself, serving to strengthen that sign of remembrance. As the casket is then processed into the church, it is greeted by the Paschal Candle in the sanctuary, serving as a reminder that Jesus Christ walks with us from beginning to end.


DAILY MORNING MASS TIME



ROMAN CATHOLIC PROVINCE OF INDIANAPOLIS



Lifting of the Dispensation from the Obligation of Mass Effective 11 June 2021

The celebration of the Eucharist at Mass is the source and summit of our life and mission as Catholics.

Since March 2020, due to the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic, all Roman Catholics throughout the entire Province of Indianapolis, which comprises all five dioceses of Indiana, have been dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. However, with the decrease of cases in our state, the widespread availability of vaccines and following the guidance of public health officials, we are now able to safely accommodate more parishioners for Masses. Therefore, effective June 11, the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass is hereby lifted throughout the state of Indiana.

Except for the unique situations as described below, those who are otherwise healthy are obliged to return to Sunday Mass by the weekend of June 12-13, 2021:

- Those who are seriously ill, exhibit flu-like symptoms and/or may have a contagious disease (including quarantine due to exposure).
- Those who are unable to attend Mass through no fault of their own (e.g. transportation issue).
- Those who are home-bound and/or incapacitated due to age, infirmity and/or medical restrictions.
- Those who have compromised health conditions and/or at high risk of contracting the virus.
- Those who are caretakers of person who are sick or of persons at high-risk of serious illness if they contract COVID-19.

If you have any questions about any specific needs, concerns or protocols, you are advised to contact your parish directly. Your pastor, who has the authority to dispense in individual cases, may be helpful in addressing individual fears and concerns.

The obligation to attend Mass is a joyful one, reflecting the very character of who we are as Catholics.


