SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT - MARCH 1, 2026

This weekend (February 28th/March 1st), the Church celebrates the **Second Sunday of Lent**. Following the temptation in the desert, our Gospel brings us to Mount Tabor and the glory of the Transfiguration. Often, our **Lenten journey** takes us from the lowness of the desert and spiritual dryness to the mountain tops and moments of overwhelming spiritual consolation. These highs and lows are part of our true relationship with the Lord.

Like St. Peter today, we might want to say "*It is good that we are here*" when we experience those mountain top moments of overwhelming spiritual consolation. We too might want to "*build tents*" to remain in those moments for as long as we can. Yet, the mountain top is not the destination; It's only part of the journey. Just as the disciples walked up Mount Tabor with the Lord, so they could not remain there; Instead, they walked back down with Him.

The meaning of the Transfiguration is not to replace the Cross, but to strengthen us for it. The light of Mount Tabor prepares us to face the darkness of Mount Calvary. As in the Scriptures, so too in our lives. God sometimes grants clarity, peace, and joy in prayer, not so that we cling to the feeling, but so that we may carry its memory into the valleys that follow. **Lent** is neither a season solely of spiritual dryness nor constant consolation. It is a journey.

On Tuesday, the priests of the Diocese will gather for our annual **Lenten Day of Recollection**. Please pray for us on Tuesday as we dedicate this time of prayer to growing in our spiritual fatherhood. Due to this day away from the parish, there will be no morning Adoration, Mass, or Confession this Tuesday.

ST. JOSEPH' DAY MASS AND TRIVIA NIGHT

On Thursday, March 19th, we will celebrate the **Solemnity of St. Joseph**, our Parish Patron. In celebration of this great solemnity, we will have a special **Mass at 6:00 PM** followed by a **Parish Trivia Night from 6:30-8:30 PM**. LENT THROUGHOUT THE LITURGY

Entering into the **Second Sunday of Lent**, we have already seen how the **Lenten** practice of fasting can be reflected even in our liturgy. As a parish, we "*fast*" from many of the joyful elements that normally draw our senses to the Lord. Our gilded altar candles and crucifix are replaced with more somber wooden ones, bleached candles replaced with unbleached candles, and the penitential color of violet shrouds the Sanctuary in vestments and altar cloths.

Liturgical hymns of praise, such as the Gloria and the Alleluia, do not rise together again from our lips until that solemn night when we celebrate Christ rising from the grave. As we recess out from Mass, following our Prayer to St. Michael, we do so in silence. Fasting from these joyous hymns that would normally ring from our lips should give us a moment of pause, calling us to enter into the silence of the tomb as we reflect on the true cost of our salvation.

Such liturgical fasting is also meant to help recall to mind the true meaning the practice of fasting. The practice of fasting is the means to an end, not the end in itself. Fasting is a means to heighten our awareness of that which is missing and deepening our sense of gratitude for what we so often may take for granted. Fasting assists us as we grow in discipleship as it trains our will and breaks us out of the complacency of the everyday.

These forty days of **Lent** are meant to somehow feel different because they are different. This journey, walked every single year of our earthly life, is meant to draw us closer and closer to the Lord each and every year. Though our world and our culture may not recognize a difference in these sacred days, let us allow the differences we see and hear be a reminder that we are called to something different, to something greater, to Heaven.
