SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - JANUARY 14, 2024

This weekend (January 13th/14th), the Church celebrates the **Second Sunday** in **Ordinary Time**. If you're wondering where the **First Sunday in Ordinary Time** went, it has already silently passed right by us. As the *Christmas season* ends with the **Feast of the Baptism of the Lord**, the **First Sunday in Ordinary Time** is never actually celebrated. Instead, we enter into the **First Week in Ordinary Time** through our weekday Masses.

Prior to the revisions of the liturgical calendar in the mid-twentieth century, **Epiphany**, like **Christmas Day**, was celebrated as an octave. The weeks after this octave and before Lent were then known as the **Weeks after Epiphany** and **Septuagesima**. This latter name means "seventy" and falls seventy days before Easter. Similar to today, this time of the liturgical year was seen as a time of preparation for **Lent**. Today, we refer to this time as **Ordinary Time**, though there is nothing "ordinary" about it.

The term "Ordinary Time" itself comes from the "ordinal" numbering of the following weeks. Quite literally, this term means that the first week of Ordinary Time is called the First Week of Ordinary Time, the second week is the Second Week of Ordinary Time, all the way through the very last week, which is the Thirty-fourth Week of Ordinary Time. Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time simply represent the ordered and everyday life of the Church outside of Her major feasts and solemnities.

When we are in **Ordinary Time**, it is a time when we live our lives neither feasting (as we do in the **Christmas** and **Easter** seasons) or undertaking more severe penances (as in **Advent** and **Lent**). Instead, it is a call to live our lives in the ordinary and everyday watchfulness of every Christian who is awaiting the Second Coming of Jesus Christ. In this way, this season is "ordinary" only in that it helps to express the everyday of our lives.

When living for Jesus, even the everyday is no longer meant to be simply ordinary. Instead, when we live in and through Him, even the everyday and the ordinary is meant to become extraordinary. This truly is a season meant for our growth in the moral life. For this reason, our readings often reflect themes that involve the calling of the Apostles, as we hear today, and of our Lord's moral teachings and parables, that we will hear from in two weeks time.


