## WHAT IS ASH WEDNESDAY?

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent. Palm branches, blessed on the Palm Sunday from the previous liturgical year, are burned to create the ashes which will be imposed upon the forehead.

## WHY USE ASHES?

Since the Old Testament, ashes have served as a symbol of repentance. Imposing them upon the forehead serves as a reminder and an invitation to repentance and to follow God more closely.

## WHAT IS LENT?

Lent is the 40 day period from Ash Wednesday to the Sacred Paschal Triduum. It is marked by prayer, fasting, & almsgiving.

#### SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - FEBRUARY 11, 2024

This weekend (February 10<sup>th</sup>/11<sup>th</sup>), the Church celebrates the **Sixth Sunday** in **Ordinary Time**. This will be our last weekend in **Ordinary Time** for over three months as we prepare to enter the **Lenten season**. It will only be after the forty days of **Lent**, the fifty days of **Easter**, and **Pentecost** that we once again return to **Ordinary Time**. We will then spend the rest of the liturgical year in **Ordinary Time**, unpacking the mysteries we've just gone through.

The Lenten season will begin this Wednesday (February 14<sup>th</sup>) as we enter into the celebration of Ash Wednesday. We will offer three Mass times for Ash Wednesday: 7:00 AM, Noon, and 7:00 PM. This annual entrance into Lent serves as a time of recollection and penance, preparing for the greatest of all celebrations: Easter Sunday. By walking with the Lord through His own forty days in the desert, so we prepare ourselves to walk with Him to heaven.

An important part of our **Lenten** observance is found in the practices of fasting and abstinence from meat, both on **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday**. When fasting, a person eats one full meal and two smaller meals that, together, do not equal a full meal. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding from age 14 onwards. (*All Fridays during Lent are also days of abstinence from meat*.)

In addition to fasting from food, we also find forms of "fasting" reflected in our liturgy. Starting on **Ash Wednesday**, we fast from both praying the *Gloria* and singing the *Alleluia*. These two liturgical elements joyously praising God will not pass our lips again until the **Easter Vigil** when we rejoice together in the resurrection. Their absences from our Mass are meant to highlight the truly penitential nature of these forty days.

Similarly, we will continue the practice begun last year of concluding our Masses during Lent with a silent recessional following the St. Michael Prayer. This practice, encouraged by our national bishops' conference, offers us the opportunity for periods of deeper reflection and prayer. As explained by the conference: Silence "allows the community to reflect on what it has heard and experienced, and to open its heart to the mystery celebrated."

We also undergo a visual fast during Lent, as many of the adornments in the Church are simplified or removed. The sanctuary becomes a bit more bare with less floral decorations present. The gilded crucifix, golden candlesticks, and bleached candles are taken away and replaced with a wooden crucifix, wooden candlesticks, and unbleached candles. Eventually, even our devotional statuary is itself veiled as our eyes focus on the Lord alone.

#### LENTEN OPPORTUNITY—EUCHARISTIC SMALL GROUPS


Following our sign-ups over this past month, we have had four groups volunteer to help lead small groups throughout Lent. These groups will show the *Jesus and the Eucharist* series prepared this year by our national bishops' conference as a part of the **National Eucharistic Revival**. This series will run throughout the seven weeks of **Lent** as a way to help us each prepare for the coming *Easter season*.

Each weekly session is two hours and utilizes a beautiful combination of informative videos, small group discussion, and time for personal reflection. A special "*Thank You!*" to our group hosts for helping to lead this initiative for our parish family.

#### SOUND SYSTEM UPDATE

As you may have noticed over the past few weekends, we have been having an issue with our sound system. There are two wireless microphones which the presider can use, both of which have been going in and out. Earlier this week, we placed a service call with local *Stylus Technologies* who had installed our system a number of years ago. Thankfully, they were able to quickly identify and remedy the problem. Both microphones should now work with no issues.
