

Easter reminds us that, even amidst suffering, loss, and uncertainty, the final word belongs to life, to Christ.

This reality is seen even today as our nation commemorates **Memorial Day** this Monday, May 26<sup>th</sup>. This commemoration remembers and honors our servicemen and women who have served our country and given their lives in defense of our freedom. Viewed through our *Easter celebration*, we faithfully entrust these men and women into the hands of the Risen Christ, who has gone before us in death and opened the way to eternal life.

As part of our Memorial Day commemoration, join us for a special Mass on Memorial Day (Monday, May 26<sup>th</sup>) at 9:00 AM, offered for all those who have given their lives in service to our nation.

## ACTS 15—THE COUNCIL OF JERUSALEM

Our first reading this weekend comes from the Acts of the Apostles, Chapter 15. This scriptural account illustrates how the early Church resolved theological conflict through authoritative leadership. The issue at hand was whether Gentiles must first follow the Mosaic Law to enter the New Covenant. Scripture alone, which at that time was only the Old Testament, offered no clear answer. Therefore, a council was called—what could be considered the first ecumenical council—as they sought the guidance of the Apostles.

After much debate, St. Peter arises and spoke decisively to the group. Those assembled listened in silence as the debated ended with Peter's words. St. James, leader of the local Church in Jerusalem, confirms Peter's judgment. As Peter authoritatively settled the debate and provided the answer to the issue at hand, so James provides practical ways to live out Peter's guidance. The Church maintains unity as the decision is accepted by all present and beyond.

This chapter shows that Church authority—the Magisterium—is essential for preserving unity and peace in the Church. Peter's decision was accepted even by those whose views were rejected: True holiness accepts the Church's judgment in faith. The Apostles gathered around Peter serve as the model for Church governance. Without this structure, the Church would fracture—as has happened again and again to those outside of Her authority. \_\_In Christ, Fr. David


