

OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE-NOVEMBER 21, 2021

Join us for a special morning Mass on Thanksgiving Day this Thursday, Nov. 25th, at 9 AM. Come and begin this day of thanks in the Eucharist.

This weekend (November 20th/21st), the Church celebrates the **Solemnity** of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. This celebration was only "recently" added to our liturgical calendar by Pope Pius XI in 1925. Seeing the horrific aftermath of the First World War, Pius XI instituted this feast to call the whole world to turn to Jesus, the Prince of Peace and King of the Universe.

PRESBYTERAL COUNCIL

As you may have seen in the *Today's Catholic*, I was recently elected to our diocesan Presbyteral Council. Several have asked what this council is and what this appointment means. To find the answers to these questions, we simply have to look to our own Parish Council for understanding.

Our Parish Council consists of several parishioners that serve as a representation of our parish. The council offers advice and guidance to the pastor regarding the direction of the parish. On the diocesan-level, the Presbyteral Council serves the same purpose for the diocese and the Bishop as the priest-members serve as representatives of our various parishes.

Members are either voted onto the council by the priests of the diocese or appointed by the Bishop. We will meet several times a year to offer Bishop Rhoades advice and guidance regarding the direction of the diocese. Similar to a parish council, each member of the Presbyteral Council serves a three year term. These appointments do not affect our parish assignments.

DIOCESAN LITURGICAL GUIDELINES

As we prepare for Advent, our diocesan liturgical guideline have remained the same. Locally, our county did have a week of being "yellow" this month before returning to an "orange" rating regarding coronavirus transmission rates. For the time being, we will continue to follow the several precautionary measures that we do still have in place at the parish.

Most of our remaining precautionary measures are prudential practices that allow for the option of greater physical distancing and other precautions for those who have need to make use of them. We will continue to make hand sanitizer and face coverings available for use in the narthex and the back of Church. We will also continue to have several rows roped apart that allow for greater physical distancing in the front of the Church.

Liturgically, we will continue with the suspension of the distribution of the Most Precious Blood, the ordinary use of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, and announcing the exchange for the Sign of Peace at our weekend liturgies. In addition, those distributing Holy Communion will continue to make use of hand sanitizer prior to distribution and the wearing of a face covering for weekend liturgies.

These general practices allows those who are at an increased-risk for illness the option, if appropriate for them, to join us in-person for Mass while also allowing limited physical contact with others and keeping an appropriate physical distance as we gather together in worship. As always, thank you for your patience and understanding as we try our best to follow our diocesan guidelines as best suited for our parish family.

I do hope that we will soon return to taking up the collection and bring forward the gifts at Offertory. To do this, however, we will need additional volunteers for our **Ushers Ministry**. 


