OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE-NOVEMBER 23, 2025

Join us on **Thanksgiving Day** (Thursday, Nov. 27th) for **Mass at 9 AM** as we begin **Thanksgiving Day** by first giving thanks to Almighty God. There is no better way to begin this day of thankfulness than with the Eucharist, which, coming from the Greek [*eucharisteo*], means "to give thanks."

This weekend (November 22nd/23th), the Church celebrates the **Solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe**. This solemnity was originally created as a feast day one hundred years ago in 1925 by Pope Pius XI. Following the horrific loss of life experienced during the Great War, Pius XI saw that the world was drifting away from Jesus Christ and had hoped that this feast day would help to reawaken society's recognition of Christ as King.

In his papal encyclical, *Quas primas*, Pius described this feast day as the response to the rapid rise of secularism experienced throughout various European nations. The fall of local governments and collapse of monarchies gave way to the totalitarian regimes of both communism and fascism. *Quas primas* offered the stern reminder that no state, ideology, or individual could ever take the place of Christ as King.

Perhaps prophetically, Pius XI cautioned that "*as individuals and states refuse to submit to the rule of our Savior, there will be no really hopeful prospect of a lasting peace among nations.*" Instead, when Christ is rejected, societies collapse and war too often follows. It is only when we "*recognize, both in private & in public life, that Christ is King, society will at last receive the great blessings of real liberty, well-ordered discipline, peace & harmony.*"

In 1969, Pope St. Paul VI elevated this day to a solemnity (*our highest liturgical celebration*), and moved it to the last Sunday of the liturgical year. These changes sought to emphasize that Christ's kingship is not merely symbolic or historical, but oriented toward His triumphant return at the end of time. In this way, our liturgical year concludes with a renewed proclamation of our hope in Christ's ultimate victory over all creation.

FORTY HOURS DEVOTION AND THE CONSECRATION TO ST. JOSEPH

Sign-ups for our upcoming **Forty Hours Devotion** are available in the narthex. With an opening Mass on Monday, Dec. 8th at 7 PM for the **Holy Day of the Immaculate Conception**, we will once again enter into a period of continuous adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Adoration will continue throughout this time until our closing Mass on Wednesday, Dec. 10th at 7 PM. At this closing Mass, we will make together the Consecration to St. Joseph.

On Tuesday, Dec. 9th at 7 PM, we will welcome **Dcn. Rob Lortie** to serve as a special Eucharistic Speaker for our **Forty Hours**. Dcn. Rob will also preach at our opening and closing Masses and is joining us in preparation to renew his own Consecration to St. Joseph. While still in preparation for the diaconate, Dcn. Rob and his wife, Vickie, served as speakers during one of our past Advent missions focused on the Domestic Church.

I invite and strongly encourage each of us to sign-up for time in adoration throughout the **Forty Hours**. If you have never had the opportunity to spend time in adoration, now is the time. You will be amazed at how the Lord will speak to you in the quiet of your heart if you but make this time for Him.

"HAPPY (LITURGICAL) NEW YEAR!"

Next weekend, we celebrate the start of a new liturgical year with the **First Sunday of Advent**. This new year will restart our three-year lectionary cycle as we return to Year A and the Gospel of St. Matthew. Walking through this Gospel for the coming year, we will see how St. Matthew, writing primarily to a Jewish Christian audience, will place a strong emphasis on Jesus as the fulfillment of Old Testament promises. He will also emphasize Jesus' teaching on the cost of discipleship, especially fitting for those who were cast out of the synagogues and faced familial rejection for their Faith in Jesus. ~In Christ, Fr.
