

THE SOLEMNITY OF SAINTS PETER AND PAUL - JUNE 29, 2025

This weekend (June 27th/28th), the Church celebrates the **Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul**. Though celebrated annually, this solemnity is tied to the specific date of their martyrdom (June 29th) and, as such, is often celebrated at Mass during the week. When this date does fall on a Sunday, however, its celebration takes precedence over almost every other day, including Sundays in **Ordinary Time**, as we honor these two pillars of the Church.

This celebration is one of the more ancient and universal celebrations on our liturgical calendar. Traceable as a local devotion in Rome to the mid-3rd Century, devotion towards these two Princes of the Apostles quickly spread throughout the Christian world. Though many other countries initially placed this celebration in December, near to the Nativity of the Lord, the Roman date of June 29th eventually received universal acknowledgement.

FOURTH OF JULY—MASS AT 9:00 AM

Begin your celebration of our nation's independence by first giving thanks to God, the source of all freedom. Join us for **Mass this Friday**, **July 4**th at **9:00 AM** as we pray for our country and for lasting peace, justice, and unity both at home and throughout the world. In the words of St. Francis Xavier Cabrini, our country's first Saint: "We must pray without tiring, for the salvation of mankind does not depend on material success but on Jesus alone."

MASS INTENTIONS

One element of our Faith that is oftentimes misunderstood is the custom of offering Mass intentions. Whenever a priest celebrates Mass, that celebration is offered for a particular intention requested by a benefactor. Just as we are able to pray for one another through our personal prayer, so the Mass, as the greatest prayer of the Church, can be offered for special intentions.

When a Mass is celebrated for a requested intention, that prayer, like our personal prayer, seeks grace from God on behalf of those for whom it is offered. In this way, the Church Herself, through the celebration of the Mass, places before God the specific intention of the benefactor. This ancient practice unites our personal intentions with the Church's most perfect prayer.

Though the intentions most commonly offered are for our dearly departed loved ones, Mass intentions can be offered for many different reasons: for anniversaries, birthdays, special celebrations, those who are sick, in need, or even in thanksgiving for prayers answered. A small stipend is customarily offered with an intention, serving as a sign of the spiritual offering being made and of support towards the local parish priest. 
