After Jesus' birth in Bethlehem, the Holy Family was visited by three Magi from the east. They came to worship Christ and bring Him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. "Chalking the door" is a centuries-old custom where Christians, on the **Feast of Epiphany**, ask God's blessing over their homes. This practice remembers the hospitality of the Holy Family to the Magi and entrusts all in our homes to God's protection and blessing.

"In the magi, representatives of the neighboring pagan religions, the Gospel sees the first-fruits of the nations, who welcome the good news of salvation through the Incarnation. The magi's coming to Jerusalem in order to pay homage to the king of the Jews shows that they seek in Israel, in the messianic

light of the star of David, the one who will be king of the nations."

# THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD - JANUARY 7, 2024

Safe travels and God's blessing upon this new academic year to our college students returning to school this and in the coming weeks!

This weekend (Jan. 6<sup>th</sup>/7<sup>th</sup>), the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. Marking the twelfth day of the Christmas season, this solemnity is one of our more ancient celebrations on the liturgical calendar. In the first centuries of the Church, the celebration of both Christmas Day and the **Epiphany** were often celebrated on the same day. It was only in the 4<sup>th</sup> Century that these two solemnities began to be celebrated separately.

By the Council of Tours in the 6<sup>th</sup> Century, the Church universally set both Christmas Day and Epiphany as separate feast days on Dec. 25 and Jan. 6, respectively. The twelve days between the feasts were known as the Christmas season. Even with this clear separation from Christmas Day, Epiphany still encompassed at least three different scriptural celebrations: The Visitation of the Magi, the Baptism of the Lord, and the Wedding Feast at Cana.

Each of these scriptural celebrations are true reflections of the very word "epiphany," which means "manifestation," as each emphasizes the various revelations of Jesus' divinity to the world. Over time, the Christmas season grew beyond twelve days as these various scriptural celebrations received their own feast days. This is reflected even today in that our Christmas season doesn't end until the celebration of the **Baptism of the Lord** on Monday.

As with previous years, we will allow the beauty of **Christmas** to echo within our hearts and our Church for the weeks to come. Our beautiful decorations will only slowly begin to be put away following the **Baptism of the** Lord. Our Nativity scene (and perhaps a few other decorations) will remain as visible sources of prayerful meditation until the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, or Candlemas.

Candlemas served as the traditional end of the Christmas season by the end of the 7<sup>th</sup> Century. Even today, as it is a feast of the Lord, it represents the last visible ripples of Christmas in our current liturgical calendar. Though the visible liturgical aspects of the Christmas season will slowly fade away, the joy of the Incarnation is to remain ever alive in our hearts.

# **EPIPHANY CHALK AND HOUSE BLESSING**

The cover of this weekend's bulletin offers a description of the **Epiphany** House Blessing. Epiphany Chalk and Holy Water will be blessed at all Masses this weekend and available in the narthex. This powerful sacramental is a centuries-old practice that is meant to serve as a sign of our dedication to the Lord. In this blessing, we are to be reminded every time we see the inscription over the door that our homes and all those who dwell here belong to Christ.

This Thursday, I will be offering a "Teaching Mass" in the Church as a part of our Catholicism Explained Series. What is a "Teaching Mass?"
