

THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT - DECEMBER 17, 2023

A special "Welcome Home!" to our university students on their Christmas break and our service men and women on leave for the holiday. We rejoice to join together with you as one family in prayer to start the Christmas season!

This weekend (Dec. 16th/17th), the Church celebrates the **Third Sunday of** Advent, or Gaudete Sunday. Marking the "halfway" point of Advent, this Sunday receives its name from the first words of the Mass Introit, or Entrance Antiphon, from today's liturgy ("Gaudete in Domino" or "Rejoice in the Lord"). Those at our 10 AM Mass this weekend will hear our choir beautifully introduce our Mass with this antiphon before the opening hymn.

The antiphon, like most antiphons, is itself taken directly from the Sacred Scriptures. This antiphon comes from St. Paul's Epistle to the Philippians: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near" (Phil. 4:4-5). Though St. Paul would have first established the Church in Philippi during his second missionary journey (~AD 50), he would have only written this epistle itself a decade later during his imprisonment in Rome.

How beautiful it is that St. Paul, though imprisoned and awaiting execution, was still able to share these words: "Rejoice in the Lord always!" Offered as parting words and continued encouragement to the faithful in Philippi, St. Paul reminds them (and us!) that, despite all obstacles and trials in this life, Jesus is still coming to us. And, for this we rejoice, for the Lord is near; Salvation Himself is nigh at hand; God is with us, Emmanuel; We have nothing to fear!

This zealous joy is meant to overflow into our liturgy today. The penitential practices of Advent briefly give way as we "rejoice in the Lord!" Reflected not only in our entrance antiphon, but also in the priest's vestments: The violet of Advent is tinged with the gold of Christmas, creating a beautiful rose color. Worn only for this day, we are reminded that our penance always has a purpose: Our **Advent** practices are preparing us for Christmas and for Christ.

Given how short **Advent** is this year, this Sunday quickly brings us right into the second half of the Advent season. The second half of Advent, which begins on December 17th, turns our focus from the Second Coming to the historical Incarnation of the Lord. In a word, our desire to prepare ourselves for our encounter with the Lord at the end of time is only possible because He first made Himself known to us in time.

This second half of **Advent** is greeted by the **O** Antiphons, leading us into our Christmas celebrations. Each antiphon (taken from the Prophet Isaiah) is proclaimed throughout the Church's liturgy each day this week. Each antiphon will be used as a part of both the *Liturgy of the Hours* and at Mass (as the scriptural verse with the Gospel acclamation). Please see this weekend's insert offering daily prayers to help us unite the *O Antiphons* into our prayer life.

ADVENT PENANCE SERVICE

Join us this Wednesday, Dec. 20th, for our Advent Penance Service from 6:00 - 7:00 PM. Following an introductory reflection, we will have five priests available for individual confessions throughout the hour. During Confession, Adoration will be ongoing. In the Sacrament of Confession, the Lord has given us the gift of the forgiveness of our personal sins.

In our preparations for Christmas, we often clean our homes so that we are ready to welcome guests for the holiday. In this great Sacrament, we have the chance to "clean" our hearts and souls to welcome Christ for the holy day. Let us make use of this great gift in our preparations for Christmas and embrace the loving forgiveness and freedom found in Christ through this Sacrament.
