#### THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT - MARCH 12, 2023

This weekend (March 11<sup>th</sup>/12<sup>th</sup>), the Church celebrates the **Third Sunday of Lent**. This Sunday has two names, both **Scrutiny Sunday** and **Oculi Sunday**. **Scrutiny Sunday**, the more ancient of the two names, acknowledges that, on this weekend, the first of the three the Scrutinies is observed. In the Scrutinies, those preparing to enter the Church on the **Easter Vigil** are called forward and prayed over by our community to prepare for the celebration and initiation soon to come. (*This name itself dates to at least the 6th Century*.)

**Oculi** Sunday comes from the first word of today's Entrance Antiphon, or *Introit*, taken from Psalm 25: "*My eyes are always on the Lord, for he rescues my feet from the snare. Turn to me and have mercy on me, for I am alone and poor.*" This desire expressed by the Psalmist is now meant to become the desire of both the Catechumen, preparing to enter Christ's Church, and the Faithful, seeking to grow closer to Christ. In Christ, we find the He who rescues us from our misery and is the fullness of our hope.

#### ST. PATRICKS' DAY AND BISHOP RHOADES' DECREE

Please see the special insert in this weekend's bulletin from Bishop Rhoades regarding the celebration of **St. Patrick's Day** this coming Friday (March 17<sup>th</sup>) and our Lenten practice of Friday abstinence from meat. This decree, known in Church law as a singular administrative decree, in itself offers us the opportunity for a beautiful reflection on the interplay that is often found between Sacred Scripture, Sacred Tradition, and the Magisterium.

The concept of fasting and abstinence are that have strong biblical roots in both the Old and New Testaments (*cf. Matthew 9:14-15, Daniel 10:2-3*). As we heard on the **First Sunday of Lent**, our Lord Himself underwent forty days of fasting in the desert. Though the Lord Himself fasted and speaks of the fasting of His disciples (*cf. Matthew 6:16-18*), He did not impose a manner of fasting upon the world by an express commandment.

Though our Lord makes clear that we should fast, He does not state how we are to do so. As such, we now turn to Sacred Tradition and the Magisterium to guide our practices. The practice of fasting is well described by the Early Church Fathers. Pope St. Clement I, writing near the end of the 1st Century, emphasized how fasting allows for growth in virtue. Tertullian, writing near the end of the 2nd Century, extols fasting as a means of strengthening self-discipline.

As this spiritual practice has been modeled by Christ and extolled and handed down by the Fathers throughout the centuries, how it is expressly observed has been left to the guidance of the Church. The Magisterium, or the teaching office of the Church, regulates this practice throughout the centuries at the behest of the Lord (*cf. Matthew 16:19*). As the Church regulates the practice, She then also has the ability to dispense or, in our situation, commute the practice for a just cause.

Bishop Rhoades, in his decree, is exercising his share of the Church's teaching office for the spiritual good of those placed under his care (*or, all of us!*). For further reading on this, I would recommend Pope St. Paul VI's Apostolic Constitution, *Paenitemini* (1966), and our National Bishops' Conference letter, *Pastoral Statement on Penance and Abstinence* (1966). Both documents are readily searchable online and are very informative reads, especially during Lent.

#### LENTEN RETREAT—A DAY SET APART

At the advice of our Parish Council, we will be offering a day-long Lenten **Retreat** at Church on Saturday, March 25<sup>th</sup>, from 9 AM to 2 PM. This retreat will take the place of our annual Lenten Parish Mission and will consist of a variety of talks, times for prayer, Adoration, and Confession, and a parish-provided lunch. There is no cost to attend the retreat (*but a free-will offering will be taken up during the lunch to help cover food costs.*)

If you are interested in attending this "day apart" in preparation for the coming of **Easter Sunday**, please make sure to see the sign-up sheet in the Narthex. 

# St. Patrick's Day and Friday Abstinence

This year, Saint Patrick's Day (March 17<sup>th</sup>) falls on a Friday of Lent when all Catholics who have completed their 14<sup>th</sup> year of age are obligated to abstain from meat. In response to several requests for a dispensation from the law of abstinence on March 17, 2023, I hereby decree the following for the Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend:

Catholics in the Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend may substitute for abstinence from meat one of the following acts on March 17, 2023, the Memorial of Saint Patrick:

- 1. Attendance at Holy Mass.
- 2. The recitation of the rosary for the intention of peace in the world.
- 3. One-half hour of prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

This commutation is meant to preserve the penitential spirit of a Lenten Friday while also allowing for the celebration of a great saint whose feast should be celebrated in a spiritual manner and not merely in a secular context.
