THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - JANUARY 21, 2024

This weekend (Jan. 20th/21st), the Church celebrates the **Third Sunday in Ordinary Time**. Having heard the call of St. Peter from the Gospel of St. John, now we hear it from the Gospel of St. Mark. We will remain in the Gospel of St. Mark until mid-way through the Lenten season when we again hear from the Gospel of St. John. This interweaving between the two Gospels highlights the brevity of St. Mark's, being the shortest of the four Gospels.

In addition to being the shortest Gospel, St. Mark's is often seen as the most "*urgent*." In it, Jesus is often described as rushing about. St. Mark actually makes use of the Greek word " $\varepsilon \vartheta \vartheta \psi \varsigma$," or "*immediately*," 41 different times. We hear it in our Gospel today as the Apostles *immediately* left their boats and nets to follow after Jesus. Likewise, we will soon hear of how lepers are healed in an instant and the sick leap to their feet when touched by the Lord.

The theme of urgency was understood since the beginnings of the Church to point to one of the main sources for St. Mark's Gospel: St. Peter. Scripturally, we know that St. Mark was very close with St. Peter, having been with him in Rome and called by him "my son Mark" (1 Peter 5:13). Traditionally, the early Church Fathers reconfirm this belief. For example, St. Justin Martyr, writing in AD 155, refers to St. Mark's Gospel as "*the memoirs of Peter*."

This close relationship with St. Peter explains how St. Mark would have known intimate details about the life of the Lord. Papia of Hierapolis, a first century bishop and disciple of St. John the Apostle, wrote: "When Mark became Peter's interpreter, he wrote down accurately, although not in order, all that he remembered of what was said or done by the Lord. For Mark had not heard the Lord nor followed Him, but later, as I have said, followed Peter."

In other words, St. Mark's Gospel contains much of the preaching and memories that St. Peter shared with him. This helps to explain how the text itself is seemingly from St. Peter's point of view. More than the other Gospels, St. Mark is a witness to the rebukes and failings of St. Peter. This account comes directly from the mouth of a man still stung by his earlier denials, witnessing against himself, as he now gives his all to proclaim Jesus Christ.

ASH WEDNESDAY AND THE START OF LENT

Given how early **Easter** falls this year, the start of **Lent** is less than a month away. It is never too early to begin our preparations for **Ash Wednesday** and the **Lenten season**. As a part of this preparation, starting this weekend, there is a basket in the narthex to collect old palms. These palms will be burned and the resulting ashes used for the imposition of ashes on **Ash Wednesday**.

For your planning purposes, **Ash Wednesday** falls on Wednesday, Feb. 14th this year and we will offer **Masses on Ash Wednesday (Feb. 14th) at 7 AM**, **Noon, and 7 PM**. As a reminder, **Ash Wednesday** is a day of fasting and abstinence. (Abstinence refers to those from age 14 onward refraining from meat. Fasting refers to those from age 18 until age 59 eating only one full meal and two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.)

BUILDING THE DOMESTIC CHURCH KIOSK

These past many years, we've had a kiosk with *Lighthouse Catholic Media* CDs available in the narthex. Following the national trend of moving towards digital media, we've seen that these CDs are no longer being taken as often as they had in the past. Given the limited space in the narthex, we've decided to discontinue the use of this CD kiosk moving forward. The remaining CDs will be available for the taking on the table in the narthex.

Thanks to a generous donation by our **Knights of Columbus**, we will be replacing the CD kiosk with a kiosk from *Catholic Information Services* (CIS). This new kiosk offers a variety of booklets that are a part of the CIS's *Building the Domestic Church* series. This series seeks to help strengthen the domestic church, which is our families, by providing engaging, faith-based literature free of cost. Make sure to take a look at the new kiosk soon. 
