This weekend (Nov. 11th/12th), the Church celebrates the **Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time**. As a nation, we also celebrate **Veterans Day**. This annual celebration, originally known as *Armistice Day*, is a day in which we show our gratitude for those who have defended our country and kept peace throughout the world. May we continue to implore the Lord to protect the men and women serving our country and for peace in all places of strife.

In last weekend's Gospel, we heard the Lord's admonishment to "*call no man father*." This verse often raises the question of why we as Catholics call priests "Father." To understand this verse, we look at the whole passage and see that our Lord is speaking in hyperbole to His disciples. He is cautioning them to avoid the hypocrisy and, ultimately, pridefulness of the Pharisees.

Understanding this hyperbole, we can then see how St. Paul is able to call himself the father of the Corinthians (1 Cor. 12:28) without contradicting our Lord. Catholic priests, like St. Paul, are called "Father" because we, through our ordination, share in Jesus' spiritual fatherhood. This spiritual fatherhood is as real of an identity to the Priest as it to any man who becomes a father in the birth of his first child. In this way, "Father" is not a title, but an identity.

ENGAGEMENT DIRECTOR

Earlier this year, we began the search for a part-time Engagement Director to assist at the parish. This position is meant to help with the organization of events and volunteers and our outreach to our local community. As of this past week, we are happy to welcome Nick Boratenski into this role for our parish. He has quickly stepped into the role, taking on several organizational needs for our upcoming Forty Hours Devotion.

Nick brings a wealth of experience into this position, having previously worked in marketing and development for Redeemer Radio and local Helping Hands. He and his wife, Hannah, have served as the heads of our Pro-Life Committee this past year and, with their children, are actively involved in the life of our parish. Thank you for your continued prayers that this new position will help us to continue our parish's ongoing growth and outreach.

CAMPUS IMPROVEMENTS

During this past week, you may have noticed some work being done near the rectory. Alongside the rectory garage, which is located on the lower level of the rectory, is a high retaining wall. A few years ago, the safety railing running along the retaining wall broke apart due to rust and age before falling from the wall. Though the area is a low traffic area, we have always intended to replace the railing and close off the area as a general safety precaution.

An opportunity to move forward with this safety project recently came about and was started this past week. In addition to a new safety railing that will be placed on the retaining wall, a small deck is being added alongside the upper portion of the retaining wall next to the rectory. This improvement has the benefit of making the outside area near the rectory more usable while also forming a physical barrier to keep foot traffic away from the retaining wall.

The outdoor altar at St. Joseph Catholic Cemetery was set this past Friday.
