Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

What is a liturgical year? How does it differ from calendar year?

The liturgical year, also known as the "church year", is the celebration of and walking along with the life of Jesus Christ. It differs from the calendar year because our Church's liturgical year is marked by six (6) seasons:

[1] ADVENT - Four weeks of penance and preparation before the celebration of the nativity of Jesus.

[2] CHRISTMAS - Celebrating the nativity of our Lord and His manifestation to the peoples of the world.

[3] LENT - Six weeks of penance and preparation before Easter.

[4] SACRED PASCHAL TRIDUUM - The holiest "Three Days" of the Church's year, where the Christian people recall the suffering, death, and resurrection of our Savior.

[5] EASTER - Fifty days of joyful celebration of Jesus' resurrection and His sending forth of the Holy Spirit.

[6] ORDINARY TIME - Divided into two sections (after Christmas & after Easter), wherein the faithful consider Jesus' teachings and His works among the people.

> Each liturgical year starts on the First Sunday of Advent and ends on the Solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

This year, Advent begins on Nov. 27, 2022

There are many other ways to continue serving our broader community, and doing so gives witness to our Faith. In this service, we show how we are called, as Christians, to build a society that more closely resembles the Kingdom of God. It is this very concept that we will celebrate next week with the Solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

After working with Chime Master and consulting both our Parish and Finance Councils, it was decided that we are best served upgrading our current malfunctioning carillon bell system for a new model. The new carillon system has been ordered and is scheduled to be installed prior to Thanksgiving. Thank you again for your generosity and faithful support to our monthly **Rainy Day** Fund, which made this needed and unexpected change possible.

HOME BLESSINGS, TRIBUNAL WORK, AND THESIS WRITING

Thank you for your continued patience regarding the scheduling of requested home blessings. Between parish ministry and tribunal work, I am still trying to find an appropriate way to balance my calendar. I have continued to dedicate two afternoons a week to working in our Tribunal (and the occasional free evening, if needed,) as an advocate. In addition to this work, I have also had the opportunity to experience the administrative-side of the Tribunal during these afternoons.

Assisting our Judicial Vicar, Fr. Jake Runyon, I've been readily reminded of the universal (or *Catholic*) nature of the Church. Over the past two months, I've been tasked with everything from translating various documents that we have received from the Vatican (as Latin is still the official language of the Church) to contacting the Apostolic Signatura of the Roman Rota, which is the "Supreme Court" of the Church. If you wish to contact the Roman Rota, you will need to find a fax machine and hope the line isn't busy. (Hint: It's almost always busy!)

In addition to parish ministry and tribunal work, I've also continued work on my licentiate thesis. At the moment, I am still in the research phase, finding and reading a variety of sources relating to parish boundaries and registration within Church law. I was excited to hear just a few weeks ago that my Tribunal counterpart, currently studying in Rome, has chosen to pursue this same topic as a part of her doctoral dissertation. I do think the canonical literature will begin to see much writing on our country's novel view of "parish registration" in the coming years. It is quite an exciting topic!


KNIGHT'S OF COLUMBUS ANNUAL MEMORIAL MASS
