THE MOST HOLY TRINITY - MAY 30, 2021

This weekend (May 29th/30th), the Church celebrates **Trinity Sunday**. The liturgical celebration itself is traced back to the 12th & 13th Centuries. Its roots, however, go back much further to the 4th Century. At the Council of Niceae (in 325 AD), the Church, responding to the Arian heresy's denial of Jesus' Divinity, defined Jesus' Divine Sonship. From this Church council we received the Nicene Creed, the same Creed that the Church has professed for 1700 years and that we continue to profess together every Sunday.

MEMORIAL DAY MASS - MONDAY, MAY 31ST AT 9 A.M.

On Memorial Day, we commemorate the men and women who have laid down their lives in service to our nation for the sake of freedom and peace. We recognize not only their heroic sacrifice, but the sacrifice shared by their family and friends who mourn their loss. We invite you to begin Memorial Day in pray as we gather for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass at 9:00 a.m.

LIFTING OF THE DISPENSATION AND UPDATED LITURGICAL GUIDELINES

On **Friday, June 11th**, the bishops of our state, including Bishop Rhoades, are lifting the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. This means that, except for those with serious health risks and caregivers of those with health risks, Catholics are obliged to return to in-person Mass on the weekend of **June 12th/13th**.

In addition to this announcement, Bishop Rhoades, after consultation with local health experts and following CDC guidance, has updated our diocesan liturgical guidelines. Under these new guidelines, parishes are able to loosen social distancing requirements and the use of face masks within the church building is now optional. At our parish, we will continue to offer several rows of pews that maintain social distancing and face masks will continue to be available in the narthex for those who choose to make use of them.

FR. STEVE COLCHIN'S RETIREMENT

Fr. Steve Colchin, pastor of St. Mary Catholic Church in Huntington, is retiring this coming June as he nears his 75th birthday. Through his 37 years of active ministry, Fr. Steve has served at several parishes throughout our diocese, including our own. St. Joseph was Fr. Steve's first pastorate, where he faithfully served our parish family from 1991-1997. To express our parish's gratitude to and prayers for Fr. Steve, there are several retirement cards available to be signed in the narthex both this and next weekend.

What does a priest "do" when he retires? In retirement, a priest "retires" from the administrative duties of running a parish and serving as a pastor. Even when retired, a priest remains "a priest forever in the order of Melchizedek" (Ps. 110:4) and will continue to offer the Sacraments. In his retirement, Fr. Steve will be retiring to his family home in nearby Decatur and assisting in the sacramental life of surrounding parishes as needed.




