### TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - AUGUST 17, 2025

This weekend ( $August\ 16^{th}/17^{th}$ ), the Church celebrates the **Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time**. In our Gospel, Jesus does something seemingly extreme: He reminds us that there is a commitment higher than our family bonds, that is the commitment to God himself. Sometimes, the commitment to God and family are mutually supporting. Other times, however, these two commitments can be opposed to one another and cause conflict.

Ultimately, the truth of the Faith are not things that can be negotiated in order to avoid family friction. Even within the Jewish understanding, familial ties could be morally repudiated for the sake of God. This means that Jesus is essentially claiming His own divinity by stating that following after Him will cause familial division and that is acceptable because of who He is: God.

Many of us know that this Gospel is not simply a thing of the past. We may have faced the very reality proclaimed here in our own lives when choosing to live out our Catholic Faith. Many of our family members and friends may not understand our choices or might even respond to it with outright hostility. This is a form of the very division that our Lord is speaking of.

All these forms of conflict need to be borne in union with Christ, who suffered the Cross for us. Ultimately, the family of God trumps even our natural family: "My mother and my brothers are those who hear the word of God and do it." (Luke 8:21) Our Gospel reminds us that, as good as peace is, Jesus's primary mission was not to establish social peace in this life. Instead, His mission was to reveal the "narrow gate" that leads to salvation. (Matt 7:13-14)

### MINISTRY FAIR

Next weekend, there will be representatives from our many ministries in the narthex after all our Masses. I encourage you to speak with the different representatives and learn about the ministries offered here at St. Joseph. After you have a chance to learn about them, **join one!** As St. Paul reminds us, "God loves a cheerful giver!" (2 Cor. 9:7) This giving is not only about treasure, but also time. **Find a ministry that interests you and give it a try!** 

In addition to our various ministries, there will be representatives of both our Parish Office and Finance Council present. For the Parish Office, this will provide you an opportunity to update contact information or to register with the parish if you haven't done so already. For our Finance Council, if you'd like to learn about or register for online giving, they will be able to provide you with further information on how to do so.

### STREET FAIR - OPENING DAY PARADE




