TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME-AUGUST 22, 2021

This weekend (August 21st/22nd), the Church celebrates the **Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time**. Hearing the conclusion of the **Bread of Life Discourse** from the sixth chapter of St. John's Gospel, we hear how many turned away from the Lord and, in doing so, "*returned to their former way of life*." (John 6:66) Though the crowds had followed Him a great distance, in the end, only the Twelve remained.

This response of those following after Jesus parallels Israel's cry against God and Moses upon first entering the desert: "Would it not be better for us to return to Egypt?" (Numbers 14:3) Israel was prepared to turn away from the Lord, their God, and return to the slavery that He had just delivered them from. Why would they turn away? Because journey that was ahead was very challenging, just as Jesus' teachings seemed hard. (John 6:60)

This was not, however, the end of Israel's story, just as it is not the end for those who follow after Jesus. As we hear in our first reading, Israel had returned to the Lord and, after forty years in the desert, entered the promised land. Coming forth from the harsh desert, Israel renews their conviction, proclaiming: "We also will serve the LORD, for he is our God!" (Jos 24:18)

When we encounter Jesus, we are called to conversion. This path is hard; It is challenging. Yet, like Israel in the desert, it leads to the promised land: Heaven. Are we prepared to follow Jesus, even along the challenging path?

DIRECTOR OF SACRED MUSIC AND LITURGY

Over the past many months, we continued the search for our new choir director. We have had many wonderful applicants apply, several of whom had the chance to visit our campus and to meet with members of our choir. Earlier this month, however, our search came to a close. Though we had received many applications from throughout the country, we did not have to go far from home to find our new director.

We welcome **Teresa Smith** to St. Joseph as our new **Director of Sacred Music and Liturgy**. Teresa is coming to us from Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Fort Wayne, where she has served as choir director for the past eight years. Prior to this, she served as choir director at St. John the Baptist in Fort Wayne and has had many years worth of recording and performance experience with various organizations, including GIA Publications (*which produces our Glory & Praise hymnal*). She has a degree in Music Education from Anderson University.

Teresa, her husband, David, and their family moved to Bluffton from Fort Wayne several years ago. Some may already have met her and her family, as they have occasionally joined us for both weekend and daily Masses over the years. Teresa will begin transitioning to this new position starting in September. We are excited to welcome her to our parish family. I look forward, as I hope you do as well, to hearing the good work that she and our wonderful choir will be able to bring about together.




