TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME-SEPTEMBER 12, 2021

Last weekend, a couple visiting our parish mentioned to me how excited they were to see so many children and young families at Mass. I hear similar comments on a regular basis from our visitors who stop to chat after Mass. Thank you to everyone for always being so welcoming, and especially for being welcoming and encouraging to our young families at Mass with their children. This weekend (September $11^{th}/12^{th}$), the Church celebrates the **Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time**. 
