

In all of its design variations, the confessional is essentially intended to afford anonymity to the penitent. It serves to protect both the penitent and the priest while still allowing a kind of sacred intimacy in which the penitent confesses sins to God through the priest who, by their ordination, acts in persona Christi.

THE SEAL OF THE CONFESSIONAL

When a person unburdens his soul and confesses his sins in the Sacrament of Confession, a very sacred trust is formed. The priest must maintain absolute secrecy and can never reveal anything that a person has said in confession. For this reason, confessionals were developed over time with screens to protect the anonymity and privacy of the penitent. This secrecy is called "the sacramental seal," "the seal of the confessional," or "the seal of confession."



"It is necessary to confess our sins to those to whom the dispensation of God's mysteries is entrusted. Those doing penance of old are found to have done it before the saints. It is written in the Gospel that they confessed their sins to John the Baptist [Matt. 3:6], but in Acts [19:18] they confessed to the Apostles" "St. Basil the Great (Rules Briefly Treated, AD 374)

DID YOU KNOW? CONFESSIONALS

Over the past several centuries, the use of confessionals for individual confessions has been commonplace throughout the Church. This practice, however, has not always been the case in the life of the Church. The way in which the Sacrament of Confession has been offered has occasionally changed throughout the years. In the early life of the Church, publicly proclaimed sins (*such as apostasy*) were often confessed openly in church, though private confession to a priest was always an option for privately committed sins. Still, confession was not just something done in silence to God alone, but something done "in church," as attested to in the *Didache (AD 70)*.

In its present form, the use of the confessional dates back to the period following the Council of Trent in the 16th century. Before that time, the priest normally administered the sacrament in its private form while seated on a chair in some part of the church, and the penitent stood or sat beside him and knelt for absolution. St. Charles Borromeo, the 16th Century Archbishop of Milan, was among the first to order the use of a confessional as we know it today in Milan in 1565. Since that time, the use of the confessional has remained the primary location for confessions.

While the proper place for hearing confessions is in a church, canon law foresees that for a just cause confessions may be heard in a wide variety of places outside of a confessional. For example, confessions are routinely heard in hospitals, nursing homes, and, in military situations, even on the field of battle. Yet, the confessional itself still conveys an important message to the Church and society as a whole. It communicates that this sacrament is a sacred and privileged place, which is to serve as a source of the divine healing that comes from the reception of God's forgiveness. ~Faithfully in Christ, Fr. 
