


SOMETIMES CALLED The Angelical Salutation Ave Maria

TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME-OCTOBER 17, 2021

This weekend (*October 16th/17th*), the Church celebrates the **Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time**. Our readings continue to highlight the true cost of discipleship. If we dare to follow Jesus Christ, we begin a journey and a relationship that is meant to carryover into eternal life. This journey is no easy path; This relationship will call us to conversion. But, it will also bring about a life that is filled with a joy that knows no end and can overcome every storm.

In our Gospel (Mark 10:35-45), Sts. James and John do not yet understand what they are asking for. They do not yet, at this time in St. Mark's Gospel, understand the Cross. In the end, however, St. James will be the first Apostle (*but not the last*) to shed his blood for the name of Jesus Christ. St. John, likewise, will suffer greatly for the sake of the Gospel, being plunged into burning oil before being sent into exile.

In their willingness to give even their lives to preach the Gospel, Sts. James and John witness to true discipleship. They are no longer asking for positions of authority (Mark 10:37), but instead uniting themselves to the suffering Servant from our first reading (Isaiah 53:10-11), who is Jesus Christ. In uniting themselves to our Savior, they made Him present to those to whom they preached and served. We, in turn, must do the same, allowing the Lord to work and live through us by uniting ourselves to Him.

CONTINUING EDUCATION DAYS—CATHOLIC SOCIAL DOCTRINE

After my weekend away, I spent most of this past week at Pokagon State Park in Angola. Our entire diocesan presbyterate, which includes all priests and deacons serving in active ministry throughout our diocese, gathered for three days of conferences for our "Continuing Education" days. This yearly gathering serves as a reminder that each of us are always called to grow in knowledge of God and His interactions within the world. We cannot simply stop our studies, but are always called to be students of the Master.

This year, our week covered a number of issues related to Catholic Social Doctrine. We heard from several speakers from Notre Dame University who presented on topics regarding the care of the environment, dignity of work, racism, preferential options for the poor, and immigration and refugees. Each presentation was followed by a round of questions and, often, much discussion on how to best preach on such topics within parish life.

Overall, the great commonality found within these teachings involves an encounter. By encountering the other, our neighbor, we encounter the face of Christ in them. This encounter with Christ is meant to change everything!
