THE TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME-OCTOBER 5, 2025

This weekend (*October 4th/5th*), the Church celebrates the **Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time**. Our readings take up the theme of faith, both Israel's faith under the Old Covenant and the faith to which we are called in the New Covenant. Jesus urges us not to despair even if we feel that our faith is small or weak: *God can work wonders using even the smallest of things*.

As October begins, we are reminded that the entire month of October is dedicated to the *Holy Rosary*. On Tuesday (Oct. 7th), the Church celebrates the *Memorial of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary*. This celebration dates back to the 16th Century and celebrates the Holy League's decisive naval victory over the invading Ottoman Empire at the Battle of Lepanto in AD 1571.

This victory by the Holy League, a coalition of Christian nations called together by Pope St. Pius V, halted the Ottoman expansion into European territories. Eventually, it led to a peace treaty that would bring an end to the *Fourth Ottoman–Venetian War*. The battle has long since been memorialized in art & poetry, including such modern works as Chesterton's poem *Lepanto*.

Why, though, is this victory associated with the Holy Rosary? As the battle drew near, Pope St. Pius V ordered the churches of Rome open for prayer day and night. He encouraged the faithful to petition the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary through the recitation of the Rosary for the victory of the Holy League. When he received word of the victory, he added a new feast day to the liturgical calendar: The *Feast of Our Lady of Victory*, later renamed by Pope Greogry XIII to the *Feast of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary*.

This feast day would be akin to our own *Fourth of July* celebrations today. Yet, it's true purpose is much simpler: Recognizing the power of prayer. In this month of the Holy Rosary, may we make this prayer our own. Let us take to heart a challenge issued recently by our Holy Father, Pope Leo for October: "I invite everyone to pray the Rosary every day during the coming month—for peace—personally, with your families and in your communities."




