## 5 EFFECTS OF BAPTISM

### 1. We are granted sanctifying grace.

When we are baptized, we are cleansed of original sin and, in the case of adults, all personal sin committed up until that moment.

## 2. We receive the theological virtues.

In baptism, we receive the theological virtues of faith, hope, and charity.

### 3. We receive sacramental grace.

In receiving the Holy Spirit, we are able to live the Christian life. We are capable of believing in God (Faith), of waiting on Him (Hope), and of loving Him (Charity).

### 4. A sacramental character marks our soul.

An indelible spiritual mark is imprinted upon our soul in Baptism. This mark is never lost (and cannot be repeated), making us a part of the Church, the Body of Christ.

## 5. We are made a part of the common priesthood of the faithful.

Participation is in two forms: Active participation, through evangelization and sanctifying all temporal realities, and passive participation, by receiving the other Sacraments.

#### TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME-SEPTEMBER 26, 2021

Upon entering the Church this weekend (September 25<sup>th</sup>/26<sup>th</sup>) for the **Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time**, you will be greeted by our newly repaired, cleaned, and renovated baptismal font. This font, set in the narthex, is meant to serve as a reminder of our baptism. Through the waters of baptism, the faithful enter into the Church and become members of the Body of Christ.

The baptismal font and its location in the narthex, which greets us on our journey through the nave of the Church towards the step of the sanctuary at Holy Communion, reflect the Christian's journey through the waters of baptism to the altar. This visual representation reminds us of a theological truth: The rites of initiation of the Church begin with baptism and are completed by the reception of the Eucharist (and Confirmation as well!).

In a similar and practical manner, we will now be able to bless the casket in a funeral Mass with holy water directly from the baptismal font. As our beloved deceased are greeted at the entrance of the Church, we are to call to mind the comforting promise made to us in baptism: If we live and die with the Lord, we too shall rise with Him (cf. Romans 6:3-11). After the casket is blessed with holy water, it is draped with a white pall, symbolizing the white garment received at baptism.

Once again, a special "Thank You!" to our **G.I.R.L.'s Night Out** for their fundraising efforts to make this project possible. If you are interested in learning more about Church architecture and guidelines for the placement of various items in the Church, I would recommend reading the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' document "Built of Living Stones: Art, Architecture, and Worship."

#### FIRST FRIDAY AND FIRST SATURDAY DEVOTIONS

This coming Friday, October 1st, marks the first Friday of the month. First Fridays are often associated with devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus; First Saturdays with the Immaculate Heart of Mary. On these devotional days, the Faithful are encouraged to assist at Mass and go to Confession.

To help promote these two devotions, we will be adding additional times for confession on both First Fridays and First Saturdays. Confessions on First Fridays will be heard from 5:00 - 5:45 PM and on First Saturdays from 8:30 - 9:00 AM.

#### MASS OF SOLEMN CONSECRATION TO A LIFE OF VIRGINITY

Next Sunday, October 3<sup>rd</sup>, our diocese will celebrate a **Mass of Solemn Consecration to a Life of Virginity** for Ms. Anne Therese Stephens. A lifetime consecration of virginity is one of the most ancient practices within the Church, traced back to 110 AD in the writings of St. Ignatius of Antioch.

In a consecration to a life of virginity, Anne Therese will promise to live a life of perfect continence for the sake of Christ and His Church. Differing from religious life, the consecrated virgin does not live in a convent or in any form of communal life. Instead, she continues to live in the world and serve the Church according to her own natural and spiritual gifts.

Though this consecration had seemingly fallen into disuse over the years, it was restored by Pope St. Paul VI in 1970 as a fruit of the Second Vatican Council. Anne Therese has invited our parish to join her on this joyous day (Sunday, October 3<sup>rd</sup>) at 3 PM in the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception.
