TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - OCTOBER 1, 2023

This weekend (September 30<sup>th</sup>/October 1<sup>st</sup>), the Church celebrates the **Twenty** -sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time. As we continue to pray through the Gospel of St. Matthew, we have transitioned from his fourth discourse on Church Order into his fifth narrative. Within the narrative, we continue to be taught in parables, but will see that these parables, which were addressed to His disciples, are, for the next month, now addressed to the chief priests and the elders of the people.

Intermixed between these parables, we find our Lord engaged in a series of controversies with the Jewish religious leaders. This narrative culminates in Jesus' denunciation of the scribes and Pharisees and His lament over Jerusalem. It then transitions into the fifth and final discourse of the Gospel as Jesus predicts the destruction of the temple and His final coming. These predictions will be matched with parables extolling us to live in readiness for these times.

Liturgically, we still have eight weeks of **Ordinary Time** left. The parables we are hearing will ultimately bring us to the Solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe at the end of the liturgical year. Though it is still far away, this solemnity can still be seen off in the distance. We should not hear our readings over these next many weekends without keeping in mind the truth born by this solemnity: Jesus Christ is King! He is our King! He is King of all the universe!

This truth has a deep meaning. Our personal relationship with Jesus cannot remain only within ourselves. Instead, it is to be lived out everyday, reflected in how we treat one another. Every one of us are united as subjects to the one King.

#### ONGOING PARISH PROJECTS AND BEYOND

You most likely noticed some of the construction work being done on the campus over the past two weekends. If everything comes together, you should be greeted next weekend by a new slab of concrete alongside our handicap parking in the parking lot. Once the concrete is set, we will move forward with installing the old church bell and our two new flag poles. A special "Thank You!" to parishioners Andy and Clayton Vachon and Rick Singer for their work to help guide this project to completion.

As previously mentioned, with both this project and the altar at the cemetery nearing completion, we are now in a place to begin moving forward with our upcoming Church renovations. Our first step in this project involves consulting with a church architect for a professional opinion of what is needed and what can be done. In addition to updates in flooring and painting, a noticeable need, very evident at our 10 AM Mass, will be to consider ways to increase our seating capacity as our parish family continues to grow.

Earlier this week, I contacted Bill Heyer of William Heyer Architect out of Columbus, Ohio. Bill is a church architect who comes highly recommended by our diocesan offices. Within Fort Wayne alone, some of his recent work includes Monday, October 2 - Twenty-Sixth Week the renovation at St. Charles and the building of both the St. Mary Magdalene Oratory at St. Vincent de Paul and the St. Francis Oratory at the University of St. Francis. He is also currently consulting with St. Rose of Lima in nearby Monroeville for their renovations.

Having spoken previously with Bill, he had the opportunity to visit our parish last year to see the Church and meet with some of our staff and parishioners. I look forward to starting our conversations with him to learn what possibilities there are open for our parish to consider. Once this process begins, we will open conversations for input and feedback. As this will be the first major renovation of Friday, October 6 - St. Bruno, Priest; the Church in many years, I hope you are as excited as I am and invite your prayers throughout this entire process.
