Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Q. How did Christ show and prove His divine power?

A. Christ showed and proved His divine power chiefly by His miracles, which are extraordinary works that can be performed only by power received from God, and which have, therefore, His sanction and authority.

O. What, then, did the miracles of Jesus Christ prove?

A. The miracles of Jesus proved that what He said was true, and that when He declared Himself to be the Son of God He really was what He claimed to be.

Q.Could not men have been deceived in the miracles of Christ?

A. Men could not have been deceived in the miracles of Christ because they were performed in the most open manner and usually in the presence of great multitudes of people, among whom were many of Christ's enemies, ever ready to expose any deceit. If Christ performed no real miracles, how, then, could He have converted the world and persuaded sinful men to give up what they loved and do the difficult things that the Christian religion imposes?

Q. Could not false accounts of these miracles have been written after the death of Our Lord?

A. False accounts of these miracles could not have been written after the death of Our Lord: Neither His friends nor His enemies would have believed them without proof. Moreover, the enemies of Christ did not deny the miracles, but tried to explain them by attributing them to the power of the devil or other causes. The Apostles and the Gospel writers suffered death to testify their belief in the words and works of Our Lord.

TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME-SEPTEMBER 5, 2021

This weekend (*September 4th/5th*), the Church celebrates the **Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time**. In our Gospel (*Mark 7:31-37*), we hear of Jesus' continued healing ministry. This word, "*Ephphatha!*", used today is also used in our baptismal liturgy. After an individual has been baptized, the celebrant touches their ears and mouth, praying that the newly baptized may hear God's word and loudly proclaim it.

Just as the man miraculously healed in today's Gospel is changed, so we are changed in baptism. Through baptism, the Holy Spirit produces in our souls, in the supernatural order, effects comparable to those which Christ produces in the body of the deaf and mute man. Once we pass through these saving waters, we are freed from Original Sin, our bodies become temples of the Holy Spirit, our souls are forever marked for Christ, and our hearts are open to receive His saving words.

Each of, then, is called to preach the good news. In baptism, we have first encountered Christ. This encounter is never meant to end. Our relationship with Jesus Christ is only meant to grow and deepen. What is started through the waters of baptism is meant to continue, to well-up, and to flourish even unto the Kingdom of Heaven.

BAPTISMAL FONT UPDATE

Several weeks ago, our baptismal font was taken in for restoration and renovation. As we have been able to trace this same font back to the old church on Cherry Street, it has seen many years of wear and tear. Partnering with *Mazzolini Artcraft*, work on the font is underway. Of initial concern was a prominent crack in the baptismal bowl itself, but this has been able to be safely repaired. The interior of the bowl is being given a tiled-insert (*pictured*) and will be sealed so as to prevent any water damage moving forward.




